SCREENING | BRIEF INTERVENTION | REFERRAL TO TREATMENT

In Q1 2024, we launched the Student Health Hub alongside universal screening in two middle schools and deepened our partnerships with local community providers. Almost 200 kids were screened—over 50% required follow-up, and 92% of those who needed additional care were matched with a provider.

for social emotional needs and substance abuse issues using the "Check Yourself" online tool developed by Seattle Children's Hospital.



50% of students screened required brief intervention 30% yellow flags 20% red flags

Every student had a follow-up assessment with the school counselor if they had a screen with a red or yellow flag.

13 students referred to care

after meeting with the school counselor. 12 students matched

with a behavioral health service provider out of the 13 who were referred to care. 5.5 days average turnaround

time from referral submission to match



Number of referrals by provider organization




